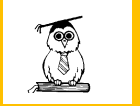


West End Primary School Geography Curriculum Content Map

<p>The EYFS framework is structured very differently to the national curriculum as it is organised across seven areas of learning rather than subject areas. This plan identifies the EYFS prerequisite skills for Geography in the national curriculum which are taught across the year in Foundation stage 1 and 2.</p>						
Foundation Stage 1 (Nursery)	<p>Maths</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understand position through words alone. For example, "The bag is under the table," – with no pointing. Describe a familiar route. <p>Discuss routes and locations, using words like 'in front of' and 'behind'.</p>		<p>Understanding the world</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use all their senses in hands-on exploration of natural materials. Begin to understand the need to respect and care for the natural environment and all living things. <p>Know that there are different countries in the world and talk about the differences they have experienced or seen in photos.</p>			
Foundation Stage 2 (Reception)	<p>Understanding the world</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Draw information from a simple map. Recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries. Explore the natural world around them.
